We will repeat this process at the quarterly changing of the art. The cost will be \$25 with no commission charged. If you just want to hang a few pieces there will be a \$5 hanging fee and 20% commission for each piece. We will discuss these options at our next meeting.



BOB will set up a 10 x 10 tent for your use in front of the Courthouse by 7:40am. There are three 4' tables available in the foyer of the Chamber of Commerce for your use as well as a banner to hang in the rear of the tent. You have to provide your own chair.
